PRESS RELEASE Cache County Offices Move to Soft Opening

In accordance with Utah Executive Order Moving the State COVID-19 Public Health Risk Status From Red (High Risk) to Orange (Moderate Risk) issued by Governor Gary Herbert April 29, 2020; and following the Phased Guidelines for the General Public and Businesses to Maximize Public Health and Economic Reactivation, version 4.0, an addendum to Utah Leads Together 2.0; Cache County offices will move to a SOFT OPENING effective Monday, May 4, 2020.

ACCESS TO COUNTY BUILDINGS:

CACHE COUNTY ADMINISTRATION BUILDING

County offices in the administration building will remain open for most departments by appointment only. It is highly recommended that as much business with the county be done online as possible. However, if transactions cannot be completed online, appointments can be made with individual departments with the exception of the Department of Motor Vehicles which will be conducting business on a first come, first served basis. Please make appointments with the departments before arriving so accommodations can be made to allow access to conduct business.

NOTE: Transactions in the DMV and most other offices will be strictly limited to **ONE PERSON PER HOUSEHOLD**. In the case of Marriage License applications, access will be limited to the couple applying for the license.

CACHE COUNTY HISTORIC COURTHOUSE

Access to the Historic Courthouse will be open.

It is expected that employees and patrons will follow the precautionary protocols set by the CDC, the State of Utah and the Bear River Health Department for the COVID-19 pandemic. This soft opening is expected to remain in effect until Friday, May 15, 2020.

Cache County Executive, Craig Buttars, expresses appreciation for the public's patience and willingness to comply with these guidelines so that we will be in a position to move to a Low Risk protocol as soon as possible.
